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**Photograph 1.** Structure 1, 28 Wells Avenue. This concrete structure was formerly part of the Otis Elevator complex, and was constructed in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.



**Photograph 2.** Structure 4, 5 Buena Vista Avenue. The Metro North and Amtrak train station, constructed in 1911 from designs by Warren & Wetmore, architects of Grand Central Terminal in New York City.



**Photograph 3.** Structure 5, [26] Wells Avenue. This four-story concrete structure was formerly occupied by the Otis Elevator company, and was constructed in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.



**Photograph 4.** Structure 6, [31] Wells Avenue. This concrete and masonry structure was formerly one of the buildings which housed the Otis Elevator company, and was constructed in the early  $20^{th}$  century.



**Photograph 5.** Structure 8, [43] Dock Street. This art deco office building dates to the second quarter of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.



**Photograph 6.** Structure 9, 39-41 Dock Street. This pair of one-story commercial structures dates to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.



**Photograph 7.** Structure 10, 2 Bashford Street. This three-story brick commercial and residential structure dates to c.1875.





**Photograph 12.** Structure 15, 5-7 Woodworth Avenue. This three-story masonry structure, apparently formerly the site of a discount clothing store, retains painted signage from the mid  $20^{th}$  century.



**Photograph 13.** Structure 18, 29 Warburton Avenue. Philipse Manor Hall. Constructed initially during the late 17<sup>th</sup> century and with substantial additions up to the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century, this masonry structure is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is a National Historic Landmark.



**Photograph 14.** Structure 19, 64-66 Warburton Avenue. A two-story masonry commercial structure with expansive areas of glass and iron and pressed tin façade, dating to c.1900.



**Photograph 15.** Structure 20, 62 Warburton Avenue. This four-story mixed-use structure dates to the last quarter of the 19<sup>th</sup> century.




**Photograph 16.** Structure 21, 7 Wells Avenue. A three-story masonry structure, dating to c.1900.


